Hospitalization Process

Need for Hospitalization

Identifying the need for inpatient treatment for an adult:

- 1. The person has a mental illness and is at least 18 years old?
- 2. As a result of that illness, the person can reasonably be expected, within the near future, to intentionally or unintentionally seriously physically injure themselves or others?
- 3. The person has engaged in an act or acts or made significant threats that are substantially supportive of this expectation to harm self or others?
- 4. The person is unable to attend to those basic physical needs and demonstrated inability to attend to needs, due to their mental illness?
- 5. The person's judgment is so impaired that they are unable to understand their need for treatment and continue behaviors can reasonably be expected to result in significant physical harm to self or others, as deemed by defined competent clinical opinion?
- 6. This person's behavior been observed within the last 24 hours?

Adult Hospitalization

- Two Types:
 - 1. Voluntary
 - A. The consumer **meets criteria** for inpatient hospitalization **and** realizes the need for treatment and **agrees to that level of care.**
 - 2. Involuntary
 - A. The consumer **meets criteria** for inpatient hospitalization and **does not realize the need** for treatment and **does not agree to that level of care.**

Voluntary Hospitalization

- Criteria met and person **agrees** to that level of care.
 - 1. Complete a “Formal Voluntary/Application for Admission Form” for the hospital the consumers requests admission to.
 - Explain their rights to treatment
 - Provide them with a blue rights booklet
 - 2. Have the consumer sign the application on the front and on both rights sections on the back.
 - 3. Keep a copy of the form to be scanned into the consumer’s chart.
 - 4. Provide copy of the form to the consumer
 - 5. Send original copy to the hospital

Petition-PCM 201

- Petition must be completed by an individual, 18yrs of age or older, who has personally observed the individual doing acts or making statements that meet criteria for involuntary admission, a person requiring treatment.
- Personal observations will support the need for involuntary hospitalization and should be specific, factual information observed within the past 24-48hrs.

PCM 208 Clinical Certificate

- PCM 208 accompanies petition and is completed by physician, psychiatrist, or licensed psychologist (within last 72hrs).
- Clinical Certificate will conclude with the examiner determining the individual is a person requiring treatment (going to be admitted to inpatient hospital care) or not requiring treatment(negative certification).
- Either way, the original certificate must be given to probate court the next business day. Copies of the certificate will be given to inpatient unit, HBH, law enforcement, ER and consumer.

The Pickup Order: PCM209A

- If a consumer requires examination, and s/he “refuses” to be examined, two documents are required:
 - 1. A pickup order (Supplemental Petition to Application for Hospitalization and Order for Examination, PCM 209A) MUST be filed with probate court
 - A. This order MUST be sworn to by petitioner and signed by the probate judge.
 - 2. And a Petition/Application for Hospitalization, PCM 201.
- The Pickup order (PCM 209A), signed by the judge, along with the Petition (PCM 201), allows law enforcement to take the consumer into “Protective custody” and transport the consumer to the hospital.

The Pickup Order: PCM209A

continued

- Once the consumer arrives at the hospital/screening site, one of three outcomes will happen:
 - 1. The person meets criteria for hospitalization and decides to go voluntarily
 - 2. The person meets criteria for hospitalization and will need to go involuntarily
 - 3. The person does not meet criteria for hospitalization and returns home.

PCM 230-Notice of Noncompliance/Request for hearing

- Completed for individuals on ATO or AOT who are in need of admission to inpatient hospital treatment and unwilling to go voluntarily.
- Personal observation of the individual who is endangering themselves by acts they are doing or failure to comply with ordered treatment, will be needed.
- Enables law enforcement to pick up person and return them to the hospital.
- A Hearing will be scheduled for the person to modify ATO/AOT and complete treatment.

PCM 201-Petition for Assisted Outpatient Tx-(Kevin's Law)

- Primary difference is the individual's understanding of the need for treatment is impaired to point that they are unlikely to participate in treatment voluntarily
- Individual is currently noncompliant with treatment and it has been a factor in the individual's placement in psychiatric hospital jail prison at least 2 times within the last 48 months

Petition/Order to Transport Minor

PCM 240

- When a minor, under age 18yrs old cannot be safely transported to preadmission screening or inpatient hospitalization, a PCM 240 may be utilized and law enforcement ordered to transport minor.
- Must be completed by parent/guardian and must state that unsuccessful efforts were made prior the request for order to transport.
- Petitioner must appear before probate judge, be sworn in and sign.
